Findings from the latest research on what influences children in their pathways to adult life and the role of parents.

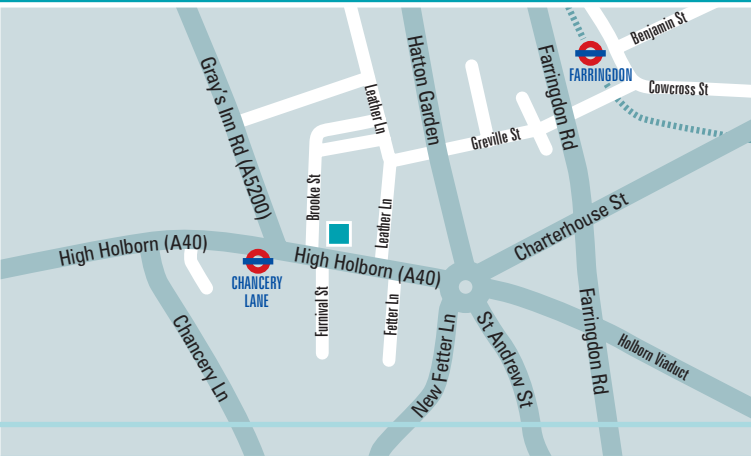
What works?
